Organization Chart of Occupational Safety and Health Council


- Established under the "Occupational Safety & Health Council

- Statutory body for promoting safety and health at work and sustaining the valuable workforce of Hong Kong











Laws and Regulations of OSHMS in HK

- Occupational Safety and Health Ordinance
 - ✓ Passed in 1997
 - ✓ This Ordinance is to ensure the safety and health of persons when they are at work
 - ✓ The Ordinance specifies the general duties of employers, occupiers and employees
- Factories & Industrial Undertakings (Safety Management) Regulation
 - ✓ Passed in1999
 - ✓ Makes it mandatory for contractors and proprietors of certain industrial undertakings to establish safety management system (SMS)





Safety Management Model in Hong Kong



- There are 14 key process elements in the system, including-
- 1. Safety policy
- 2. Organizational structure
- 3. Safety training
- 4. In-house safety rules
- 5. Inspection programme
- 6. Hazard control programme
- 7. Accident/incident investigation
- 8. Emergency preparedness
- 9. Evaluation, selection and control of sub-contractor
- 10. Safety committee
- 11. Job hazard analysis
- 12. Safety and health awareness
- 13. Accident control and hazard elimination
- 14. Occupational health assurance programme




Training and Education Programs on OSHMS

- OSHC is the major course provider on OSH in HK
- Currently, the Council provides more than 250 courses on OSH
 - ✓ more than 40 courses exactly focusing on OSHMS, including occupational safety management, occupational safety and health training techniques, etc.
- OSHC also offered tailor-made training courses for government departments and companies in the public and private sectors















Hong Kong Occupational Injuries Statistics (1998-2012)

- Number of occupational injuries:

 Decrease from 63,526 in 1998 to 39,907 in 2012 (\$\sqrt{37.2\%}\$)
- Injury rate / 1,000 employees:

 Decrease from 26.7 in 1998 to 14.1 in 2012 (↓47.2%)





Hong Kong Industrial Accidents Statistics (1998-2012)

- Number of industrial accidents:

 Decrease from 43,034 in 1998 to 12,547 in 2012 (\$\sqrt{70.8\%}\$)
- Accident rate / 1,000 workers:
 Decrease from 64.7 in 1998 to 21.3 in 2012 (↓67.1%)






Hong Kong Construction Accident Statistics (1998-2012)

- Number of construction accidents:

 Decrease from 19,588 in 1998 to 3,160 in 2012 (\$\square\$ 82.1%)
- Accident rate / 1,000 workers:
 Decrease from 247.9 in 1998 to 44.3 in 2012 (\$\sqrt{83.9\%}\$)






Hong Kong Occupational Diseases Statistics (1998-2012)

- Number of occupational diseases:

 Decrease from the peak 948 in 1998 to 280 in 2012 (↓70.5%)
- Incidence rate / 100,000 workers:
 Decrease from 39.7 in 1998 to 9.9 in 2012 (↓75.1%)




