3.2 Data collection methods for statistics

This data is collected and compensated by the National Social Security Fund (NSSF) for the workers.

3.3 Laws and regulation concerning OSH

Occupational safety and health is defined in Chapter VIII of Labour Law 1997 and Ministry of Labour and Vocational Training has issued 27 regulations concerning about OSH in garment, shoes, service, and construction sectors. Currently, the department of occupational safety and health is planning to establish OSH Act in collaboration with Korea occupational safety and health agency (KOSHA).

3.4 Labor Inspection System

The labour inspection in Cambodia was established by the Labour Law which promulgated by the Royal Decree CS/RKM/0397/01 dated 13 March 1997 and the Prakas 037/14 KB/PK dated 21 February 2014 on the establishment of joint labour inspection team.

Labour inspection is a system to monitor the enforcement of laws and other legal instruments related to the labour sector, which is implemented by the authority of labour inspectors, labour administrative inspectors, labour medical inspectors or other officials who are appointed to do the labour inspection.

The Ministry of Labour and Vocational Training (MLVT) established the joint labour inspection team to fulfil their roles and responsibilities for inspection of enterprises and establishments in the Kingdom of Cambodia

as indicated in the labour law. The joint labour inspection team composes of 8 units as the following:

- Department of Labour Inspection
- Department of Labour Dispute
- Department of Employment and Manpower
- Department of Child Labour
- Department of Occupational Safety and Health
- Department of Training
- National Social Security Fund (NSSF)
- General Secretariat of the Committee of Resettlement of all Strikes and Demonstrations


Currently, the inspection has been reformed in facilitating to the investors in Cambodia. The inter-ministerial inspection teams are established by the joint of Ministry of Labour and Vocational Training, Ministry of Industry, Science, Technology and Innovation, Ministry of Tourism, and Ministry of Environment

Type of labour inspection:

- Regular Labour Inspections: These inspections are carried out on a regular basis with prior notice to the owners, managers of enterprises. The notification letter specifies the objective of the inspections and states the required documents.
- Special labour inspections are conducted without prior notice after labour inspectors found irregularities, which are stated in the labour inspection reports and the letter of corrective order. During the special labour inspections, if it is found out that the owners,

managers of the enterprises or the establishments continue not to comply with the labour law, they are subject to fine according to the penalty provisions and other measures from relevant ministries or institutions.

3. Unplanned special labour inspections are conducted after receiving complaints, requests or information about risks of work accidents from the public and/or the social network etc. relating to noncompliance with the labour laws and regulations.



4 Workers' accident compensation insurance

The Law on Social Security Schemes extends the National Social Security Fund (NSSF) to provide a financial security net for civil servants and those in the private and informal sectors. There are 11 chapters with 107 articles. The law passed the Council of Ministers on 02nd August 2019. The law was discussed and approved by the national assembly on 08th October 2019, and was promulgated on 02nd November 2019. The law on Social Security Scheme for persons defined by the Provisions of the Labour

Law, was promulgated on 25th September 2002 by the Royal Order No. NS/RKM/0902/018. Additionally, the law covers only workers in private sector.

OSH management systems are introduced by individual enterprises. The government has been promoting the basic of OSH management systems based on the Plan -Do-Check-Act (PDCA) cycles by means of training and programmes. The government encourages all workplaces, including small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) and informal economy workplaces to develop PDCA cycles adjusted to their own working conditions. Moreover, training such as Work Improvements in Small Enterprises (WISE), Work Improvement in Neighbourhood Development (WIND), Work Improvement for Neighbourhood Development and Youth (WINDY), and Work Improvement in Small Construction Sites (WISCON) are provided by the government as useful measures to promote continual improvement and develop basic OSH management systems.

Following the ILO World Day for Safety and Health at Work, which celebrated annually on 28thApril. Cambodia has also organised the World Day for Safety and Health in April or May since 2005. The event is organized in different locations at national and sub-national levels such as Special Economic Zones and garment factory areas, with one event being held at Koh Kong on 3rd May 2019, with participation of 1,300 workers. This special

campaign was presided over by the Minister of Labour and Vocational Training and accompanied by senior officials from the MLVT, as well as employers' and trade unions' organisations. Events and campaigns related to OSH are held for raising public awareness of the importance of OSH
