Industrial Rehabilitation Centre

 - -Personal Training Activities
 - 3. The sufficient economy project for balanced way of living
 - 4. Public relations project to disseminate rehabilitation performance and promotion of occupational safety
 - 5. Prosthetic devices invention project for medical rehabilitation

The National Agenda "Decent Safety and Health for Workers" (2017-2026)

With the following framework and guidelines:

- 1.Promoting safety and health among working people;
- 2.Emphasizing on prevention, in order to minimize the risk of exposure to hazardous working conditions, and the occurrence of occupational and work-related diseases;
- 3.Creating the network and participation of activities under the civil state approach;
- 4.Building up preventive culture on occupational safety and health;
- 5.Developing the mechanisms for the administration of occupational safety and health at all levels.

National Master Plan on Occupational Safety, Health and Environment (2017-2021)

with the following mission:

- 1) Establish and develop preventive or promotional measures on occupational safety and health (OSH);
- 2) Promotion labour protection in all sectors on the issues of workers' rights, duties regarding occupational safety and health, to enhance their safety and health at work;
- 3) Creative and develop occupational safety and health network and collaboration among all relevant sectors;
- 4) Develop mechanisms for the administration and operation of occupational safety and health;
- 5) Monitoring, control and follow-up occupational safety and health issues.

The National Master Plan covers 4 strategic issues as follow:

- Strategy 1 Promoting and developing explicit knowledge on occupational safety and health;
- Strategy 2 Promoting, monitoring, supervising and developing preventive measures on occupational safety and health;
- Strategy 3 Promoting collaboration and developing network or partnership on occupational safety and health;
- Strategy 4 Developing effective mechanisms for the administration of occupational safety and health.

Chart 1: Cases of occupational accidents and injuries, as classified by severity 2017



Chart 2 : Cases of Occupational Accidents and Injuries by Size of Establishment



Chart 3: Cases of Occupational Accidents and Injuries by Type of Establishment (Top 5)





Labour Inspection System

- Department(s) responsible for Labour Inspection
- Scope of labour inspection
- OSH inspectors'powers
- OSH inspectors' enforcement powers
- Worker's accident compensation insurance

Department(s) responsible for Labour Inspection

The Ministry of Labour

- Department of Labour Protection and Welfare (DLPW)
- Social Security Office (SSO)

The Ministry of Industry

Department of Industrial Works (DIW)

The Ministry of Public Health

Scope of labour inspection

- responsible for overseeing compliance with general working conditions, occupation safety and health, labour welfare and labour relations
- responsible for ensuring compliance with the Labour Relations Act with regard to the establishment of trade unions in enterprises, the negotiation and application of collective agreements and the settlement of labour disputes.
- empowered to bring to the attention of the competent authorities any improprieties or abuses that are not specifically covered by existing legal provisions
- advice and information

OSH inspectors'powers

- 1. Power to enter workplaces
- 2. Power to inspect and carry out any examination, test or enquiry
- 3. Power to investigate

4. Duty to provide advice on OSH

OSH inspectors' enforcement powers

- 1. Power to issue orders or notices
- 2. Power to impose financial penalties
- 3. Power to revoke or suspend licenses or authorisations
- 4. Power to require the cessation of dangerous work
- 5. Power to initiate prosecutions
- 6. Power to conduct prosecutions
- 7. Other enforcement powers

Worker's accident compensation insurance

1. Work-related accidents

The employer shall inform such accident/incident to the Director-General of the Department of Labour Protection and Welfare (or a designated person) with procedures as stipulated within 15 days. Although requirements on recording and/or investigating the causes of such accident are not clearly stated, it implies that the employer shall do so and the record of information shall be retained for further inspection by the OSH inspector.

2. Occupational diseases

In case of an abnormality of the employee is detected; or the employee is developing a symptom or illness relating to work, the employer shall arrange for the employee to receive medical treatment immediately; and further carry out an inspection or find out the cause of abnormality for prevention purposes.

The employer shall keep the records of employee's health check up including relevant information to be ready for inspection by an OSH inspector at all times.

Employers' duty to notify OSH authorities of work related death and/or injuries to health

the employer shall perform as follows:

1.If an employee is death, the employer shall report to a designated governmental OSH inspector immediately

2.If the establishment is damaged or has to stop operation or there is any person in the workplace encounters danger or injury as a result of fire, explosion, leakage or other severe incident, the employer shall report to a designated governmental OSH inspector immediately

3.If an employee encounters danger or illness in according to the Workmen's Compensation Law, after the employer report such danger or illness incident to the Social Security Office in according to such law, the employer is also required to submit a copy of the report to the governmental OSH inspector within 7 days.

6.Challenge in Implementing OSH

Labour policy under Workmen's Compensation Fund Social Security Office

Objectives:

 To guarantee compensation for employees to relief difficulties in cases of accident and disease from work-related

 To provide rehabilitation for disabled workers so that disabled workers can earn his/her living, not be burden to society

 To promote occupational health and safety promotion of Safety at work and good quality of life or labour welfare.

The issue to improve in relation to OSH:

coordinating by integration between

- -the Social Security Office and
- -the Department of Labour Protection and Welfare to visit enterprises together

The issues for inspection visit

- to verify general conditions of work
- to check concrete steps and improvements undertaken by employers
- to check on OSH
- to suggest about Social Security and Workmen's Compensation benefit

The ASEAN Social Security Association (ASSA)member counties sent 8 participants from 8 countries attend the training program


